During this period he was the representative of Gerald Metals Inc. in Chile, a leading company specialised in copper and metals trading.

From 1990 to 1994 he was the Codelco Development Vice-president, and then became General Manager of AMP Chile, a Chilean subsidiary of AMP Ltd. Group, Australia's largest institutional investor.

Until 2006, he was the general manager of Compañía Contractual Minera Leonor, a subsidiary of Equatorial Mining Limited, Australia, and Board Director of Compañía Contractual Minera El Tesoro and of Empresa Nacional de Minería (ENAMI).

He is currently Board Director of ICARE and Aguas Andinas. And representing Codelco, he is Board Director of Electroandina, Edelnor and GNL Mejillones.

He is a lecturer for the graduate programme in Mineral Economics at Universidad de Chile; member of the Copper Expert Committee under the Ministry of Finance and author of several papers on mining policies and the international copper industry.
